



## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

- 1. What will be the nature of care delivered by Ghana-Canada Medical Centre – will it be for only women and children?*

The Ghana-Canada Medical Centre will be a Medical Clinic providing a general 24-hour walk-in clinic. Although the facilities are specially geared towards women's and children's health problems, the clinic will also provide care for all as a walk-in clinic.

In addition the clinic will be well equipped to undertake diagnostic laboratory analyses and imaging services for own patients as well as referrals from other facilities. With world class doctors and specialists, the clinic will also focus on the crucial areas of cardiac and endocrine diseases – dealing with heart problems, diabetes, thyroid and immune diseases of all kinds.

- 2. How will the Ghana-Canada Medical Centre be governed?*

The Medical Centre will be managed by a six-member Board of Directors, including the original promoters, who together have a combined start-up equity position of nearly \$500,000.00 (US). The directors have an extensive and outstanding expertise in all aspects of the project, and play an active role in the company.

- 3. Investing in Ghana-Canada Medical Centre: With 2008 being an election year in Ghana, will the business of Ghana-Canada Health Company be affected by any change in government?*

The impact of government policies on any business can be for better or worse. Nevertheless, while Ghana-Canada Health Company is not immune to political risk, that risk will be mitigated by the quality of care delivered and the commitment of the government to promote the private sector as the engine of growth and poverty reduction.

- 4. Financing: Now that the company has funds to construct and start the Medical Centre, will it accept new investment in the enterprise?*

The short answer is yes. Additional finance will be used to ensure the object of being a state of the art operation. Being well capitalized will facilitate any required upgrades and the acquisition of equipment of the latest technology. Moreover additional funds would also help shift the debt to equity ratio or enable a fast pay down of debt.

**5. Share Price: What is the share price?**

The share price is \$0.45, effective January 1, 2008. The number of individual and corporate investors will also be capped to comply with regulations applicable to a private company.

**6. Becoming a Shareholder: How do I become a shareholder or increase my shareholding and is there a minimum subscription?**

The company is private and has no public offering. Persons interested in acquiring shares are advised to contact Dr Kwame Danso or any director of the company. The minimum subscription is U.S. \$10,000

**7. Participation: Do I have to be a shareholder to work at the centre?**

No. All medical practitioners are welcome to offer their services to help make the facility world class.

**8. How can I offer my services as a medical practitioner?**

Medical practitioners – doctors, technicians, nurses, etc – in Ghana or abroad will be encouraged to offer their services under agreed terms and conditions. *Services may be offered on renewable short term or long term contractual basis.* Such services will complement the work of the full time staff.
